



## **National Archery in Schools Program style shoot to be held at the Lincoln County Fairgrounds July 5, 2008.**

**All students who have participated in the program through their school curriculum and/or have participated in any of the NASP Regional / State / National shooting events may register for this event. Awards will be given for the top three shooters in Elementary ( 4-6th grade ), Middle ( 7-8 grade ) , and High School ( 9-12th grade ) for both boys and girls.**

### **FORMAT**

#### **Authorized Equipment**

1. Equipment will be provided at this shoot. However if you bring your own Genesis bow or other equipment, judges will inspect equipment for compliance before shooting begins.
2. Only the NASP Genesis compound bow (target colors or camouflage) may be used.
3. No sights, tape, marks, or other modifications to the bow that may, in the opinion of the judges be used as a sighting aid or draw stop are allowed. Any marks or tape placed on the riser, above the grip of the bow, must

be removed or covered or the bow will be disqualified. If such a bow is used during this shoot, the archer will be disqualified. If the archer is using a camouflaged color bow, opaque tape must cover



the face of the riser otherwise identified by the school or shooter with tape, such markings should be on the bow limbs or below the bow's grip.

window. If a bow must be numbered or otherwise identified by the school or shooter with tape, such markings should be on the bow limbs

4. Only NASP full-length, size 1820 aluminum arrows may be used.
5. Only stock 2.8 inch plastic vanes and 65 grain target points are permitted on the arrows.
6. Finger tabs, "no-glove" string attachments, gloves, and armguards may be used.
7. The use of mechanical release aids or stabilizers is not allowed.
8. Sims vibration dampening devices may be attached to the limbs of the bow.

#### **Range Set-Up:**

1. Targets will be the standard NASP 80 cm FITA face with 10 scoring rings.
2. Target butts will be placed directly on the floor similar to the height of school butts.
3. The target line will be approximately 6 feet from the target butts.
4. There will be 10 and 15 meter shooting lines.
5. The waiting line will be 10-15 feet beyond the 15 meter shooting line.

#### **Range Operation:**

1. NASP whistle commands will be used to operate the range; 5+ whistles for an emergency, 2 whistles to "get bow", 1 whistle to "shoot", and 3 whistles to "go get arrows".
2. When instructed, each archer will shoot 1 practice end (group) of 5 arrows at 10 meters.
3. Each archer will shoot 3 ends of 5 arrows for score (total of 15 shots) at 10 meters.
4. Each archer will shoot 1 practice end of 5 arrows at 15 meters.
5. Each archer will shoot 3 ends of 5 arrows for score (total of 15 shots) at 15 meters.

#### **Scoring for All Divisions:**

1. All students will call and score their own arrows.
2. When the 2 shooters have shot, they will be instructed to "go get arrows". Only these two shooters will approach the target to score and retrieve their arrows.
3. Arrows should not be touched before they are first scored and recorded.
4. Arrows touching or cutting a scoring ring line will be given the higher score.
5. NASP Judges will call disputed arrows.
6. Archers must sign each other's score card before leaving the range at the conclusion of the flight.
7. Judges will escort archers who need to shoot bounce-outs to the appropriate lanes.
8. Judges will deliver signed score cards to the scoring table at the end of each flight.
